HOW TO FIND "HOBBY ACRES"

(Cabin & Wildflower Preservation
of the W. B. Carroll's which is
3 miles East of Siler City.)

FROM GREENSBORO:

When approaching Siler City via Highway #421 - Keep left hand road at large intersection just outside of town; follow this road until it crosses #64 just east of the overhead bridge. Turn left follow #64 for distance of 3 miles. Watch for temporary cardboard sign on right side of highway and Davis Service Station on left. Intersection of roads shown on sketch at bottom of this page.

FROM ASHEBORO:

Follow new Highway #64 - this by-passes Siler City. After crossing overhead bridge follow directions "FROM GREENSBORO".

FROM SANFORD:

Follow #421 to second stop light in town of Siler City. This will be the intersection of #421 and #64-A. Turn right here (Smith & Buckner funeral home in right-hand corner) and follow #64 to Intersection of roads described in "Directions from Greensboro".

FROM PITTSBORO:

It is not necessary to go all way to Siler City in order to get to "Hobby Acres". You will need to turn off #64 about 3 miles east of Siler City. Watch for temporary cardboard sign on left side of highway and Davis Service Station on right at Intersection of roads shown on sketch at bottom of this page.

CAUTION:

Be sure to keep these instructions as "Hobby Acres" is not the home of the W. B. Carroll's and should you ask when you reach Siler City, how to find their home you would not find the place of our meeting; since the Carroll's will be at "Hobby Acres" there will be no one at the home to direct you.
