NEWS LETTER

"Windy Hill", home of the J. A. Warrens, was the scene of the fall meeting of the N. C. W. F. Society. Members visiting Mr. Warren's wild flower garden for the first time were surprised and delighted to find such wildwood beauty in the heart of the Village. Towering ancient trees, a natural stream and hillside, plus extensive plantings of azaleas and wild flowers, combined to make a charming garden. The numerous varieties of ferns were the center of interest at this season of the year. In the midst of this delightful setting the members enjoyed a picnic lunch and social hour before the meeting.

Program: Dr. E. T. Brown, from the University of North Carolina, discussed Lilies of North Carolina, using colored slides to show the different species in bloom. A native of Chapel Hill, Dr. Brown is well acquainted with lilies of the state, and he expressed concern over the dwindling supply of these plants, urging their conservation and propagation.
