Please include only plants that are in the wild (native or naturalized)—no garden plants.

Species with an asterisk (*) are not native to our area but have naturalized here.

The Society ranks invasive plants by the threat level: Rank 1 [!1] = Severe Threat, Rank 2 [!2] = Significant Threat, Rank 3 [!3] = Lesser Threat, Watch List A [!4] = naturalizing and may become a problem, Watch List B [!5] = known threat in other states but not yet a problem here. - *[!3] Common Groundsel, *Senecio vulgaris* (in bloom & fruit). Roadsides and edges, 2/3/20 (Lisa Gould).
- *[!2] Common Chickweed, *Stellaria media* (in bloom). Yards and edges, 1/5/20 (Lisa Gould) + throughout the rest of January & February.
- Frost Aster, *Symphyotrichum pilosum* (a few blooms). Muddy Creek Greenway, 1/4/20 (Lisa Gould).
- *Common Dandelion, *Taraxacum officinale* (in bloom + fruit). Edges & lawns, throughout January and February (Lisa Gould).
- *White Clover, *Trifolium repens* (in bloom). Lawn, 1/16/20 (Lisa Gould).
- *[!2] Ivyleaf Speedwell, *Veronica hederifolia* (in bloom). Lawns & edges, 1/5/20 + throughout the rest of January & February (Lisa Gould).
- *Persian/Bird's-eye Speedwell *Veronica persica* (in bloom). Lawns & edges, 1/5/20 + throughout the rest of January and February (Lisa Gould).
- *[!2] Periwinkle, *Vinca minor* (in bloom). Edges, 2/28/20 (Lisa Gould).
- **Common Blue Violet,** *Viola sororia* (in bloom + fruit). Lawns, 1/5/20 + throughout the rest of January & February (Lisa Gould).
